

Customized programs

The Thursday schedule also features full-day programs for orthopaedic residents and allied health practitioners (included with registration).

The **Resident Program** begins with a series of presentations from the Young Physicians Committee, led by Committee Chair Pamela C. Luk, MD, and Vice Chair Amgad M. Haleem Amin, MD, PhD. ANNUAL MEETING 2019, CONTINUED

The **Allied Health Practitioner Program**, developed by the new AOFAS Allied Health Work Group under the leadership of Thomas M. Hearty MD, DPT, will cater to advanced healthcare professionals who work with patients before, during, and after foot and ankle surgery.

The daylong program includes presentations on operative, non-operative, and postoperative care of various foot and ankle conditions. Attendees will gain in-depth knowledge of the Foot and Ankle Exam through lectures and a hands-on breakout session. In the breakout, attendees will work in smaller groups to perform a foot and ankle exam with expert faculty guiding them through the process.

The program also features a keynote presentation from CarolLynn Meyers, PT, regarding compression wrapping and postoperative care after foot and ankle reconstruction.

Special presentations

AOFAS Annual Meeting 2019 includes compelling invited speakers and special symposia for attendees.

Keynote Speaker Rebecca Costa, a sociobiologist, futurist, and author of the international bestseller *The Watchman's Rattle: A Radical New Theory of Collapse*, will look at advances in Big Data, genomics, and other cutting-edge technologies and how you can use these tools to anticipate and prepare for the future.

Kenneth A. Johnson International Speaker Cristian A. Ortiz, MD, of Chile will discuss if there is a rotational component to metatarsus primus varus in a special symposium on forefoot treatment on Friday morning.

Presidential Guest Speaker Richard Kent, PhD, also joins the program on Friday to speak on the biomechanics of injury and the design and assessment of injury prevention countermeasures. Dr. Kent's background as an international expert in automotive crash injury prevention has informed the NFL's research to improve assessment tools for sports injury protection.

The **Posters with the Presidents Tour** is back by popular demand! Join AOFAS past presidents in the Exhibit Hall on Friday to view scientific posters, ask questions of the poster presenters, and enjoy light refreshments.

Research Guest Speaker James G. Wright, MD, MPH, FRCSC, FRCSEd, will deliver a talk on Saturday focused on his work to advance evidence-based orthopaedics. Dr. Wright is an adjunct senior scientist at the Hospital for Sick Children (SickKids) Research Institute in Toronto, Canada, and the chief of economics, policy, and research at the Ontario Medical Association.

FELLOWSHIP MATCH

New Fellowship Match cycle begins

Another cycle of the AOFAS-sponsored Orthopaedic Foot & Ankle Fellowship Match began on August 5 with the opening of applicant registration. This year's match, for 2021-22 positions, will be the second one conducted across all orthopaedic subspecialties that use SF Match Residency and Fellowship Matching Services. (Hand uses a different matching service and is not included.)

This year's match has 48 programs registered to participate with a total of 76 positions offered. Applications will continue to be accepted by many of the programs until March 2020, but applicants are advised to apply as early as possible and to check individual programs for their deadlines and interview dates. The list of all participating programs can be found at aofas.org/fellowshipmatch/applicants.

Applications and all supporting documents, including reference letters, must be submitted to SF Match at *www.sfmatch.org*. SF Match notifies programs when applications are available for review and administers the rank lists and the match process itself. AOFAS staff is available to help applicants and programs with questions or issues.

The match is designed to be a transparent, unbiased process that matches applicants to foot and ankle fellowships on a competitive basis. Participating programs sign an agreement with AOFAS, and both programs and applicants are required to adhere to the Code of Conduct of Orthopaedic Fellowship Programs and Applicants. Applicants must have graduated from an allopathic or osteopathic medical school, and fellowship is dependent upon successful completion of an approved orthopaedic surgery residency program.



Upcoming FAI and FAO supplements

Starting this summer, *FAI* features the International Consensus Meeting on Musculoskeletal Infection 2018 (July issue); *FAO* Essential Review Articles, vol. 2 (August issue); and AOFAS Annual Meeting 2019 Highlights (November issue).

Musculoskeletal Infection

The July issue supplement presented the recommendations of the International Consensus Meeting on Musculoskeletal Infection 2018: Findings of the Foot and Ankle Work Group. As stated in the opening editorial from Amiethab A. Aiyer, MD, Steven M. Raikin, MD, and Javad Parvizi, MD, "The questions contained in this supplement and their respective answers represent a guide to help manage patients with infectious complications."

"In July 2018, several hundred delegates from 98 countries gathered in Philadelphia, PA, as part of the International Consensus Meeting (ICM) on orthopaedic infections to discuss these issues. Surgeons, physicians, and scientists worked together over a two-year period to help more clearly delineate the best way to prevent, diagnose, and treat orthopaedic infections. In addition to discussing general infection concerns, delegates worked in subspecialty workgroups to identify issues pertaining to those respective fields, including foot and ankle surgery. This supplement represents the collaborative efforts of nearly 20 orthopaedic foot and ankle surgeons and infectious disease specialists from across the globe that culminated in generating this document. Each question and issue were thoroughly researched and the consensus developed following the strict Delphi criteria. The recommendations are based on detailed analysis of the current available literature and the personal experience of internationally renowned physicians experienced in foot and ankle surgery."





FAO Essential Reviews

In August comes the second print volume of the Foot & Ankle Orthopaedics® Essential Review Articles. FAO Editor-in-Chief L. Daniel Latt, MD, PhD, and FAO Assistant Editor for Review Articles Daniel C. Farber, MD, invite you to read these featured reviews covering core topics in foot and ankle surgery. This printed supplement includes two classic topics: hallux valgus and hallux rigidus. Also highlighted are three important contemporary topics: stress fractures, patient reported outcomes, and biologics.

In partnership with the *FAI* CME committee, CME questions are being developed for the entire collection of *FAO* essential reviews articles. When aggregated, the complete set of questions will serve as a basic foot and ankle exam for board study and foot and ankle rotation evaluation.

The full FAO Essential Review series is also available on the FAO website (look for the starred collection at the bottom of the FAO homepage). These review articles are ideal for medical schools, residency programs, and fellowship training programs, as well as a resource for exam preparation and general review. Visit FAO to read these review articles, new research, and more.



Search for new FAI Editor-in-Chief underway

AOFAS is now accepting applications for a new Editor-in-Chief (EIC) of Foot & Ankle International.

Requirements

- Have a strong background in clinical and academic foot and ankle orthopaedic surgery
- Have extensive experience with peer-reviewed scholarly journals
- Be an Active Member of the AOFAS
- · Possess the appropriate organizational skills
- Be willing to commit sufficient time to manage a monthly peer-reviewed publication and its editorial team

Position Responsibilities

The EIC is expected to model leadership and vision for the Journal, and to lead the editorial team in advancing the goals, scholarly achievements, academic leadership, and impact of the Journal in the field of foot and ankle surgery.

The EIC is an ambassador for the Journal to AOFAS members, the orthopaedic profession, and the field of foot and ankle surgery.

Responsibilities of the EIC include management of the Journal editorial policy and functions, including oversight of the peer-review process, all aspects of editorial review, timely management of the manuscript workflow, and coordination with the publisher.

The EIC is expected to oversee current, and to innovate future, special features of the Journal, which in the past have included editorials, letters to the editor, podcasts, special supplements, surgical technique videos, etc.

The EIC is responsible for leadership and management of the editorial board (assistant and associate editors and reviewers), holding regular meetings thereof, and preparing reports for and meeting with the FAI/FAO Managerial Board at least twice a year.



DONOR SPOTLIGHT

Scranton's vision inspires the Foundation's life-changing humanitarian efforts

"I knew I couldn't ask others for support if I didn't put my own gift on the table first," said Pierce E. Scranton Jr., MD, the founding president of what is now the Orthopaedic Foot & Ankle Foundation. In 2000, Dr. Scranton launched a campaign to raise funds for an AOFAS humanitarian trip to Vietnam to treat patients with lower extremity injuries and deformities, particularly victims of landmine explosions.

As we celebrate the AOFAS 50th Anniversary and reflect on the Society's many accomplishments, the establishment of this humanitarian trip, now known as the Overseas Outreach Project to Vietnam, stands out. Former AOFAS President Ronald W. Smith, MD, describes Dr. Scranton as a visionary whose insight inspired the Society's humanitarian outreach, garnering support from both members and industry partners.

"We needed to broaden our focus beyond research and education, and provide the spark to make it happen," Dr. Scranton recalled. He and his wife, Elaine, contributed the first \$100,000 to the Foundation (then known as the Outreach and Education Fund). Dr. Scranton's commitment and determination attracted \$150,000 in personal support from Biomet co-founder Dane A. Miller, PhD, and his wife, Mary Louise, as well as

corporate contributions and overwhelming support from the AOFAS board. The campaign exceeded its initial goal.

When Dr. Scranton was AOFAS president in 2001, the worldwide financial crisis was worsening. The Society needed to reassess its programs and direction.

While Dr. Scranton noted the importance of research and education, he said, "We needed to demonstrate that we make a difference, showing that as the world's experts in foot and ankle health, we live our values in the service of others."

What began as a small group of physicians traveling to Vietnam at their own expense to perform surgeries and teach overseas has expanded to an annual trip involving more than 60 Society members to date. Through the Overseas Outreach Project to Vietnam, more than 3,500 patients have been seen by AOFAS members with nearly 1,500 of the patients receiving surgical treatment. This fall, an additional humanitarian program is planned in

Kenya with other locations being explored for 2020.

Speaking of his work in Vietnam, Dr. Scranton said, "it has taught me to be a better doctor." He recalled one year when he and AOFAS member William H. Gondring, MD, MS, performed a surgery on a young woman who had lost her leg from a landmine explosion. The procedure enabled the patient to wear a prosthetic leg. "Before the operation, she had felt hopeless and tried to end her life," Dr. Scranton reflected. "This surgery changed her life."

Dr. Scranton's philanthropic work extends beyond the Foundation as well. Five years after graduating from medical school, he endowed a scholarship at Kenyon College, his undergraduate alma mater, in memory of his track coach, Donald White. Dr. Scranton also played an important role in Kenyon College's record-breaking endowment campaign as a member of the college's Board of Trustees.

Currently in active retirement after a long career in private practice and 18 years as the team physician for the Seattle Seahawks, Dr. Scranton is assisting the final fundraising activities for the Foundation's Campaign 50 along with Drs. Smith, E. Greer Richardson, and Thomas O. Clanton. The campaign aims to raise \$3 million in honor of the AOFAS 50th Anniversary.

HUMANITARIAN OUTREACH

AOFAS surgeons treat underserved patients in Vietnam

AOFAS surgeons returned to Vietnam this year to care for children and adults with lower extremity deformities and disabilities as part of the Orthopaedic Foot & Ankle Foundation Overseas Outreach Project to Vietnam.

This year's volunteer group included 11 foot and ankle orthopaedic surgeons from four different countries. Each doctor spent one week working with local surgeons to evaluate and treat patients in hospitals and clinics in Hanoi, Vinh, and Ba Vi. Many of these patients are from impoverished areas and are unable to afford specialized medical services.

"The program is a life-changing experience both personally and professionally. It will take you out of your comfort zone and remind you why you decided to be a doctor and surgeon," said volunteer Justin L. Cashman, MD, MBA, of Annapolis, Maryland. "Treating patients who have the greatest need, with little to give in return, is very rewarding. I can't say enough about the experience."

Many resources and advanced techniques used in the United States are not available in Vietnam. Volunteer Phinit Phisitkul, MD, from Sioux City, Iowa, noted that his most memorable experience

during the trip was "performing the first ever flatfoot reconstruction at the Viet Duc Hospital for a young man with severe flatfoot deformity, despite limited instruments and without intraoperative radiography."

Volunteer F. Scott Gray, MD, from Danbury, Connecticut added that, despite the language barrier between the AOFAS and Vietnamese surgeons, there was an unspoken rhythm present in the operating rooms. "On many occasions, I had no problem getting any instrument I needed without asking," he said.

Recognizing the importance of education and collaboration with their Vietnamese counterparts, the volunteers from the third week presented at the Nineteenth Annual Seminar on Surgery of the Lower Extremity, co-sponsored by AOFAS, Mobility Outreach International, Vietnam Ministry of Health, and Viet Duc University Hospital. The Vietnamese orthopaedic surgeons attending the seminar utilized simultaneous interpretation devices.



In addition to Drs. Cashman, Phisitkul, and Gray, AOFAS volunteers included Angel Arnaud, MD, Monterrey, Mexico; John A. DiPreta, MD, Albany, New York; Justin M. Kane, MD, Dallas, Texas; Kathleen A. McHale, MD, Alexandria, Virginia; Naomi N. Shields, MD, San Antonio, Texas; Altug Tanriover, MD, Ankara, Turkey; Joan R. Williams, MD, Santa Monica, California; and Yuan Zhu, MD, Shanghai, China.

Surgeons volunteered their time and paid for their travel to Vietnam. In-country expenses were covered by the Orthopaedic Foot & Ankle Foundation, supported by a grant from Stryker. The Society's partner organization, Mobility Outreach International, provided onsite assistance.

The Overseas Outreach Project to Vietnam is open to Active, Candidate, and International AOFAS members. Applications for the 2020 trip will open this fall. Visit *aofas.org/overseasoutreach* for updates.



FOUNDATION PROGRAMS

Grants awarded to foot and ankle fellowship programs

Thirty-four orthopaedic foot and ankle fellowship programs have been selected to receive a grant this August from the **Wright Medical Fellowship Scholarship Fund.**Established last year by the Orthopaedic Foot & Ankle Foundation from a \$500,000 gift from Wright Medical Group N.V., the fund was created to support orthopaedic fellowship training programs, specifically by enhancing the fellows' educational and research or other scholarly experience during their fellowship year.

The grant money is being divided equally by the number of fellows at the selected programs—56 in all—and apportioned to the programs according to the number of fellows they have for 2019-20. At the close of the grant year, the programs must submit a report detailing their use of the grant.

The Fellowship Grants Review Committee, chaired by James R. Holmes, MD, established program eligibility requirements and set guidelines for use of the funding. They also reviewed all application materials and recommended the selected programs to the AOFAS Board of Directors for their final approval. Grant award notices were sent to the selected programs in July, and checks are being distributed in August.

AOFAS awards 77 Resident Scholarships

The AOFAS Awards & Scholarships Committee has presented 77 scholarships to orthopaedic residents in training across the United States and Canada through the AOFAS Resident Scholarship Program. The program plays a key role in engaging the next generation of foot and ankle orthopaedic surgeons as it allows orthopaedic residents to attend AOFAS Annual Meeting 2019 in Chicago, Illinois, as guests of the Society.

Resident Scholarships cover registration fees for the Resident Program and Annual Meeting, as well as lodging for four nights and a transportation stipend. Each Scholar will be matched with an AOFAS member who will serve as a mentor to enhance this learning opportunity.

This year's Resident Scholarship Program is funded by the Orthopaedic Foot & Ankle Foundation, supported by grants from Arthrex, Inc., Stryker, and Wright Medical Group N.V.

- Vibrant colors and images to engage site visitors



CODING CORNER

Revisiting the 22 modifier




According to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services Medicare Carriers Manual, Appendix A, modifier 22 defines an "unusual procedural service" and "when the work required to provide a service is substantially greater than typically required." When used properly, the 22 modifier allows the provider to recover reimbursement above and beyond the regular payment for a difficult or time-consuming procedure.

The challenge of using the 22 modifier is knowing what exactly constitutes "increased procedural services." Factors contributing to "increased services" include the intensity of the procedure, the technical difficulty of the procedure, the time required, the severity of the patient's condition, and the physical and mental effort required. Specific instances could include:

- excessive blood loss
- trauma that is extensive and would complicate the particular procedure
- conditions or malformations that would make the procedure significantly more complex

While there are instances in which a particular procedure exacts a greater amount of time, effort, or difficulty, it is imperative that the provider submit very clear and explicit documentation of what was done and why it represents





Documentation is critical. Payers won't automatically increase reimbursement for a 22 modifier claim without an explicit explanation of what made the procedure more complex. Be clear in documenting when a case took longer than usual, and why it did. Be clear in documenting the patient's comorbidities and how they would influence the aftercare and the outcomes (diabetes mellitus, inflammatory conditions, smoking, etc.). If extra work adds 20-25% to the procedure, in time or effort, it constitutes use of the modifier and a reimbursement commensurate with that increased effort.

It would also be reasonable to document increased services in conjunction and consultation with anesthesia providers involved in the patient's care.

Using the 22 modifier does not ensure increased reimbursement, and not infrequently may lead to delays in revenue without the proper documentation. As is the case for most E/M and technical services, the need for provider documentation cannot be overstated.


JOHN A. DIPRETA, MD


